

Equitable health care services are services that are appropriate, safe and effective. Care must be sufficient, delivered in a timely and coordinated manner, and responsive to the individual needs and preferences of patients. Such care reduces the risk of harm to patients and prevents the waste of resources.

PUTTING ACTIVE OFFER INTO PRACTICE: STRATEGIES AND HELPFUL TIPS
